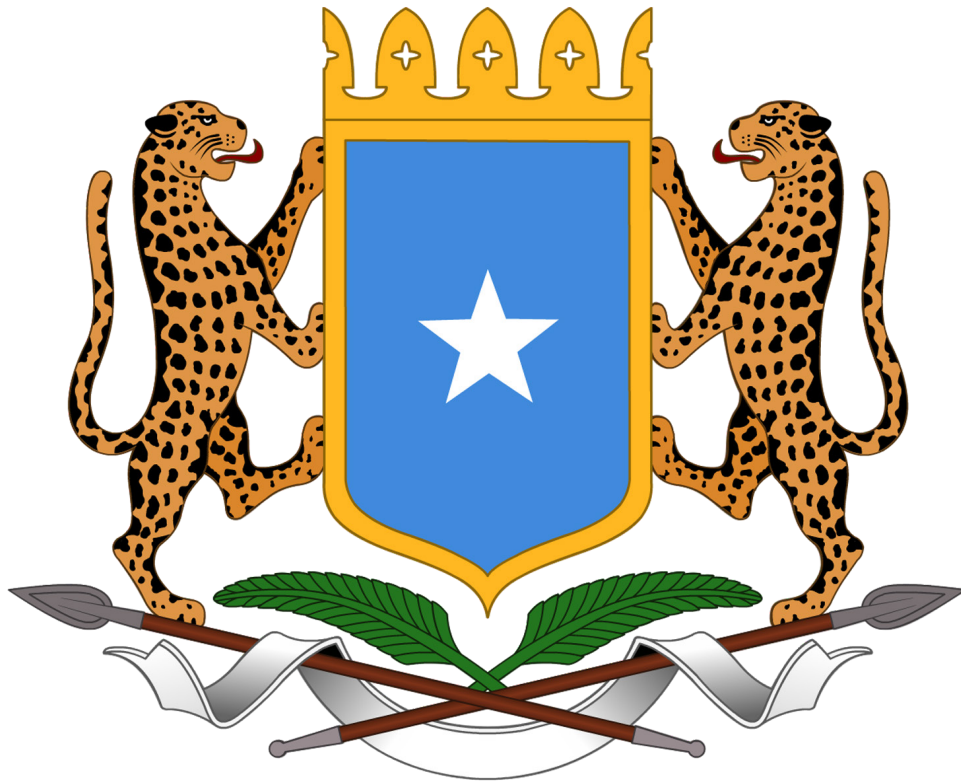

THE PROBLEM WE SOLVE

Somalia has one of the youngest populations in Africa, yet millions of young people lack access to safe, structured educational tools. Schools are uneven, curriculums vary by region, and digital access is often unsafe or dominated by outside influences. Youth face pressure from conflict, unemployment, extremist groups, and the absence of protected spaces to learn and grow.

Adults face their own challenges. Many have never had access to civic education, constitutional understanding, or reliable information about national services. Large segments of the population rely on oral knowledge, diaspora hearsay, or fragmented digital sources that may not reflect Somali priorities.

The diaspora, deeply committed to Somalia's future, remains disconnected from reliable national tools and information. There is no unified platform that brings Somalis together, strengthens identity, and protects the next generation.

Somalia needs a stable, offline, safe system that supports national cohesion, reduces vulnerability, strengthens families, empowers communities, and gives every citizen a clear path forward.

The Freedom Tablet Initiative is built precisely for this moment.

THE FREEDOM TABLET

The Freedom Tablet is a fully offline, solar-powered, non-emission, child-safe device built for emerging nations and crisis-zone education. It carries educational programs, civic modules, and cultural content designed exclusively for Somalia's needs.

It does not connect to the internet.

It does not expose users to outside influence.

It cannot be used for browsing, messaging, social media, or exposure to harmful content.

Every tablet is solar-powered.

All content preloads in Canada through IDEA's EduConnect Suite™, a secure proprietary system. Updates arrive later through Proximity Sync™ when a tablet comes within range of a Mobile Education Centre (MEC) or Freedom Hub. No networks, no online access, no data plans.

The device is durable, built for harsh climates, and powered through integrated solar solutions that remove the barrier of electricity. Families, schools, villages and camps receive equal access regardless of infrastructure.

The Freedom Tablet brings modern education and civic understanding to Somalia with transparency, safety, and cultural respect.



Offline learning is not a limitation. It is safety, dignity, and access.

THE EDUCATIONAL ECOSYSTEM

The Freedom Tablet is not a single device. It is an entire ecosystem designed to sustain national learning and deliver consistent updates across the country.

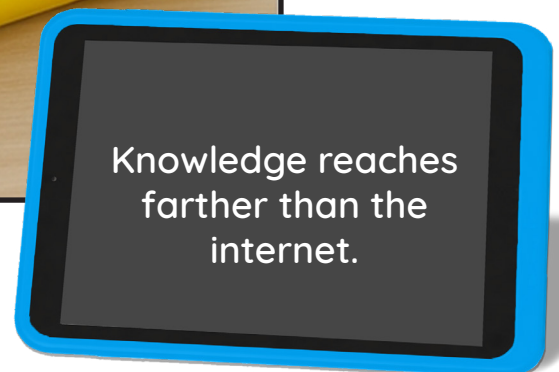
The ecosystem includes:

- Tablets for children, youth, and adults
- Mobile Education Centres with solar, storage, and Proximity Sync™
- Freedom Hubs for distribution, training, and support
- Kiosks and local centers for community access
- Portable Education Centres for crisis and refugee zones
- EduConnect™ update system for secure offline content delivery
- Somalia–Uganda regional corridor for supply, assembly, and logistics
- Solar charging built into every stage of the system

Everything is controlled by IDEA across Canada, Uganda, Somalia, and partner countries.

Everything is designed to ensure consistency, cultural integrity, and long-term stability.



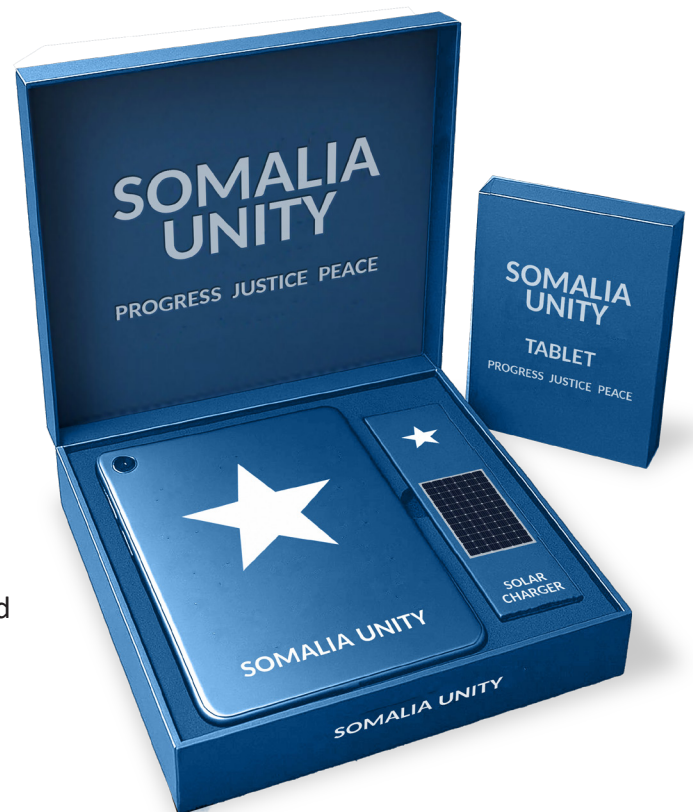
HORUMAR EDITION

Adult Civic Education & National Unity

Horumar means “progress,” and this tablet is built for adults who want to understand their rights, strengthen their nation, and participate fully in Somalia’s future. It delivers clear, simple, culturally respectful civic education: the constitution, voter readiness, governance, national identity, and the responsibilities of every citizen.

Horumar includes:

- Somali Constitution overview
- Historical timeline and key national milestones
- Photo Galleries
- Civic responsibilities
- Government structure
- Service access guidance
- National identity and unity modules
- Geography, resources, regions, people
- Diaspora roles and contributions
- Foundational literacy reinforcement where needed
- Offline, solar-based secure learning



The Horumar Tablet is designed for the diaspora and for communities with low literacy, limited access to information, or a lack of trustworthy civic materials. The program is designed to include everyone. It uses visuals, narration, Somali history, and practical examples so that every adult, urban or rural, can understand how Somalia’s systems work and how their participation shapes the future.

GAASHAAN EDITION

Youth Protection & Counter-Recruitment

Gaashaan means “shield,” and this tablet is designed to protect Somalia’s youth from recruitment pressures, misinformation, and the pull of extremist groups. The Gaashaan Tablet uses national identity, purpose, skill-building, and powerful storytelling to redirect at-risk boys toward strength, pride, community, and opportunity.

Through the counter-recruitment narrative, boys meet role models, discover patriotic history, and follow pathways that highlight courage, responsibility, and the value of choosing life over conflict. The program includes Freedom Fighter, a game designed to reinforce positive choices, and modules that teach vocational foundations, problem-solving, and emotional resilience.

Gaashaan is not just a learning tool; it is a protective strategy. It gives boys a reason to hope, a reason to belong, and a reason to stand with their families and their nation. In a world where dangerous influences reach deep into vulnerable communities, Gaashaan gives Somalia a shield strong enough to stand between its youth and those who seek to harm them.

Gaashaan includes:

- Somali heroes, cultural legends, history, values
- Purpose-building stories and role models
- Games that reward problem-solving, creativity, teamwork
- Safe story arcs exposing the dangers of extremist recruitment
- Positive alternatives: entrepreneurship, trades, innovation, national service

- Offline environment that cannot be infiltrated or manipulated

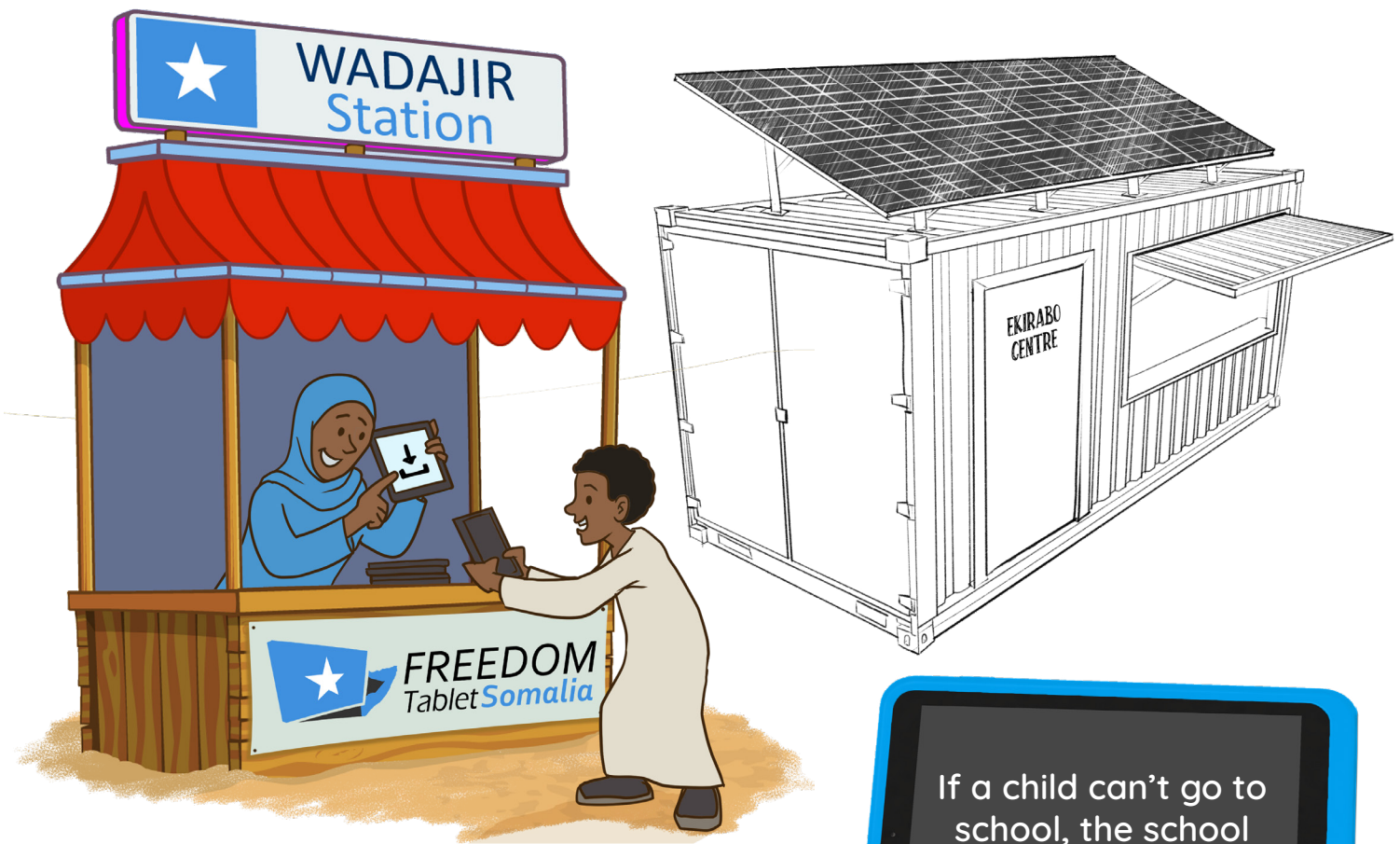
WADAJIR EDITION

Education Tablet

Wadajir means “together as one,” and this is the heart of Somalia’s education solution. The Wadajir Tablet is a fully offline, solar-powered, indestructible learning platform built for children who have been left without schools, teachers, or stability. It delivers culturally appropriate Somali learning, early literacy, numeracy, and foundational curriculum directly into the hands of children, wherever they live.

The Wadajir program restores structure, dignity, and continuity for families living through crisis. Each tablet is supported by Wadajir Stations, where trained education representatives provide printed worksheets, learning guidance, and Proximity Sync updates through IDEA’s EduConnect system. Children never need the internet, never face unsafe networks, and never lose access to learning.

For parents, teachers, community leaders, and donors, Wadajir represents hope: a way to rebuild Somalia’s future by educating every child, safely and consistently, even when classrooms are gone.

TANGIBLE ASSETS

The Somalia ecosystem includes physical infrastructure that grows with national needs.

These assets give Somalia not only a program, but a durable platform capable of reaching every region.

Tangible assets:

- Freedom Tablets with solar integration
- Mobile Education Centres
- Portable Education Centres (shipping-container classrooms)
- Freedom Hubs for distribution and training
- Kiosks for villages and public points
- Inventory management and solar docks
- Secure content preload facilities
- Uganda–Somalia supply corridor for assembly and distribution
- Regional UAE–Saudi–East Africa transport links

MANUFACTURING AND SUPPLY CHAIN

Freedom Tablets and MEC components are manufactured in partner facilities and shipped in secure sealed containers through major East African ports, including Somalia's coastal gateways. Shipments are moved by vetted logistics partners to inland hubs, Wadajir Stations, or cross-border corridors serving Uganda and neighboring states.

This approach ensures a steady flow of devices, solar components, protective cases, and educational materials without reliance on fragile infrastructure. As regional distribution expands, Somalia's ports can serve as a natural coastal entry point for equipment supporting both Somalia and partner countries until the Saudi manufacturing facility is operational.

USE CASES

Somalia will benefit from multiple deployment channels working in coordination across communities, camps, villages, and diaspora groups.

Use cases include:

- Youth protection in at-risk regions
